Patient Triage

We have been doing Patient Triage for over a month. I can say the team have worked incredibly hard in trying to get it right. We have had a few teething issues but with any new way of working it was bound to happen. However, it has helped us develop different ways of working.

How Patient Triage works.

If you have a non-urgent medical problem, follow this link https://systmonline.tpp-

uk.com/2/OnlineConsultation?OrgId=M83042 to complete the form. When filling out the form put as much information as you possibly can as this will help speed up the process when the GP is triaging. Once you have filled in the form it will be received by our team at the surgery. A doctor will triage the request and let the receptionist know the appropriate appointment to book you into. The receptionist will then give you a call to get you booked in. This will really help the way you can book appointments as it will result in less wasted appointments, you are able to see a clinician of your choice (where appropriate), you are not having to phone at 8:00am. If you deem it as urgent, please contact the practice and the receptionist will take it from there. You can fill the form out online from 5:00am – 10:00am. The clinician will be triaging between (9:00am and 12::00pm on the day).
